

IRS FORM 1095-C

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Will I receive any new health care tax forms in 2016 to help me complete my 2015 tax return?

Much like Form W-2 and Form 1099, which include information about the income you received, these new health care forms provide information that you may need when you file your individual income tax return. Also like Forms W-2 and 1099, these new forms will be provided to the IRS by the County.

When will I receive the 1095-C?

Generally, you will receive it by January 31st of the following year. However, for the 2015 statements, the date was extended by the IRS to March 31st. According to the IRS, individual taxpayers will generally not be affected by this extension and should file their returns as they normally would.

Should I wait for the form to prepare my income tax return?

Most employees will know whether they had health coverage for a month and can simply check a box on their tax return to attest that they, their spouse (if filing jointly), and any eligible dependents had “minimum essential coverage” throughout the year.

What do I do with the Form 1095-C?

Keep this form with the materials you give to your tax preparer. If you prepare your own taxes, you may need to refer to this information as you prepare your return.

Do I need to attach Form 1095-C to my federal tax return?

No, do not submit these with your tax return. However, you may need to refer to them in order to complete your tax return.

What should I do if?

- I have a question about the form I received,
- I think I should have gotten a form but did not get it,
- I need a replacement form, or
- I believe the form I received has an error?

In any of these situations, contact the individual listed on the form (see line 10 for a contact information).
